# INTRODUCTION

The Ministry of Tourism released its First Half-Year performance report for the hospitality sector. This report views the key hospitality indicators of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia in H1 2025.

The report dives into the performance of the hospitality sector, focusing on the number of newly licensed tourism hospitality facilities, room keys, occupancy rates, Average Daily Rates (ADR), and Revenue Per Available Room (RevPAR).

These indicators are viewed across various types of tourism and hospitality facilities carrying active licenses from the Ministry of Tourism, including their classifications and distribution throughout the major cities and governorates of Saudi Arabia.

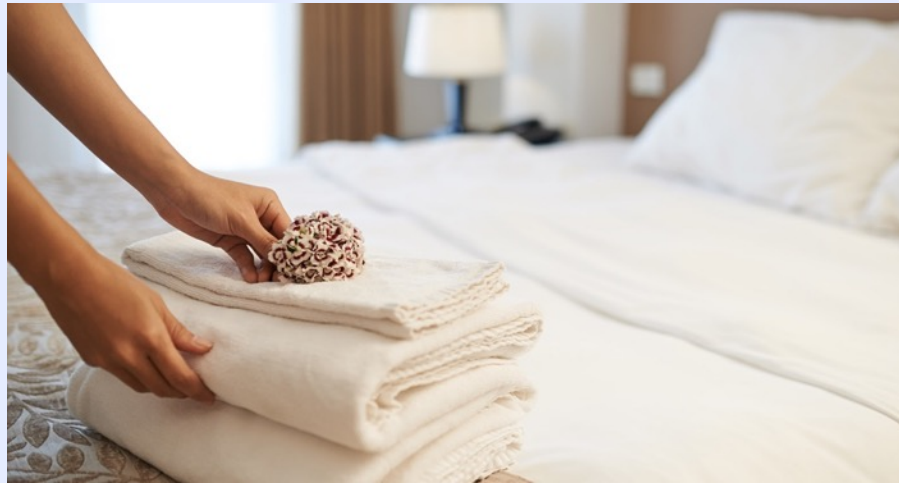

## Tourism Hospitality Facility Type

### Hotels:

Include hotels, hotel villas, boutique hotels, recovery hotels, heritage hotels, resorts and hotel apartments.



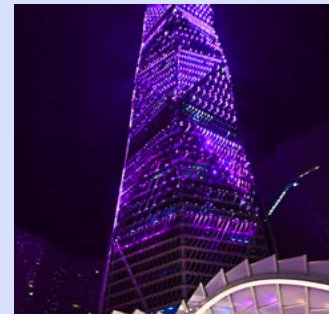
### Apartments & Others:

Include serviced apartments, hostels, camps, chalets and others.

## Terminology

### Occupancy Rate:

The percentage of available rooms that were sold during the reference period. Occupancy is calculated by dividing the number of rooms sold by rooms available. It measures how much of a facility is being utilized or rented out compared to its total capacity

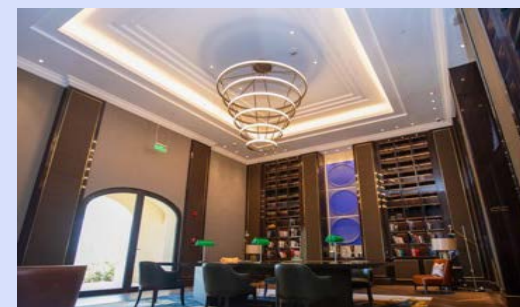


### Average Daily Rate (ADR) (﷼):

A measure of the average rate paid for rooms sold in Saudi Riyals (Excluding VAT and Municipal Services Fees), calculated by dividing room revenue by rooms sold.

### Revenue Per Available Room (RevPAR) (﷼):

Total room revenue divided by the total number of available rooms. It measures the revenue-generating efficiency of a given room.



### Licensed Facilities:

Tourism hospitality facilities carrying active licenses until the end of H1 2025 (30 Jun 2024).

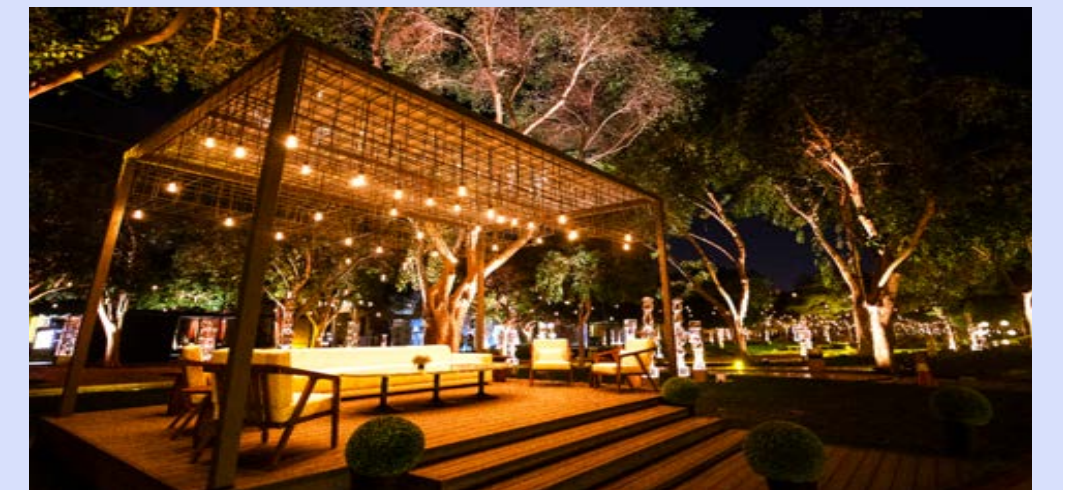


### Room Keys:

A room is the unit formed by one room or groups of rooms which are rented by guests as a whole (and constituting an indivisible rental). Rooms may be single, double or multiple, depending on whether they are equipped permanently to accommodate one, two or several people. An apartment/hotel villa is a special type of room. It should be counted as one unit/ room irrespective of the number of rooms (one or more) it consists of.

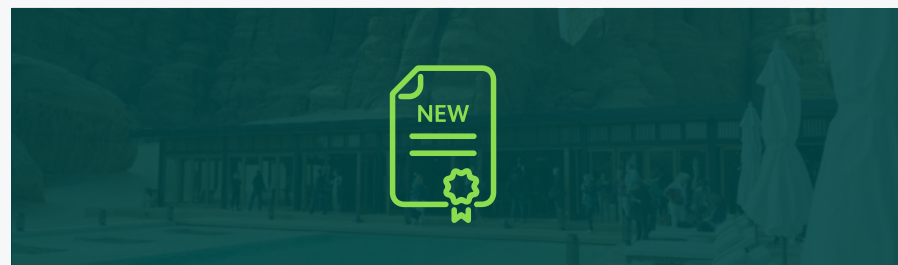

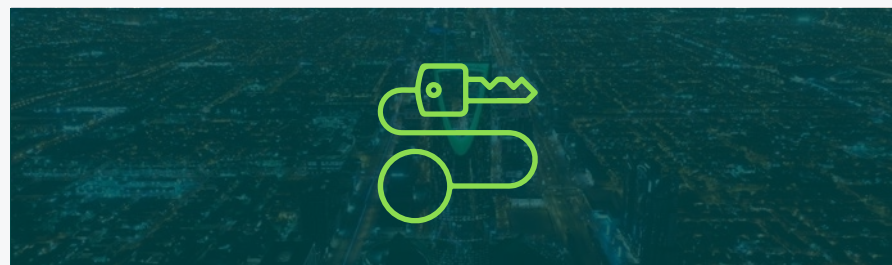

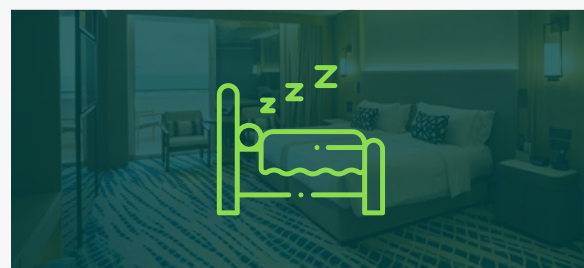

### Insights

- In H1 2025, Saudi Arabia's tourism accommodation facilities recorded an overall occupancy rate of (56.6%) for hotels, apartments & others.
- The Average Daily Rate (ADR) for all tourism accommodation facilities in H1 2025 averaged (ﷲ 458). Consequently, the Revenue Per Available Room (RevPAR) stood at (ﷲ259).
- As of H1 2025, (5,326) tourism accommodation facilities were licensed, (47%) for hotels and (53%) for apartments & others across Saudi Arabia.
- As of H1 2025, a total of about (545K) room keys in licensed tourism accommodation facilities were recorded, (83%) for hotels and (17%) for apartments & others across Saudi Arabia.

## Overall Hospitality Sector Performance in Saudi Arabia – Monthly



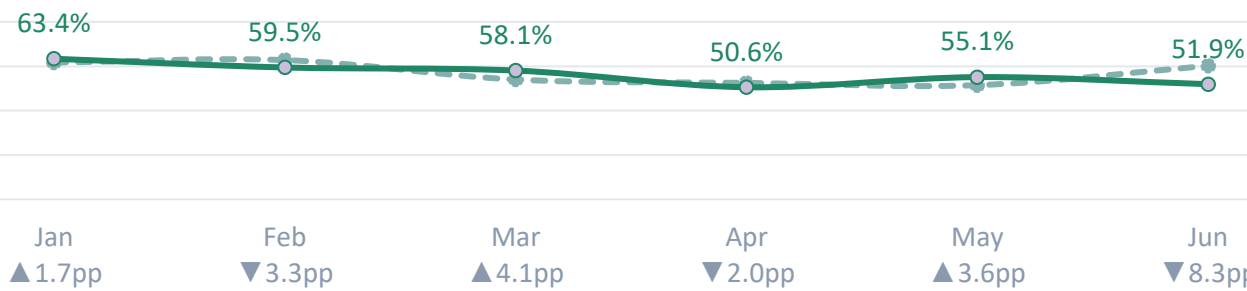

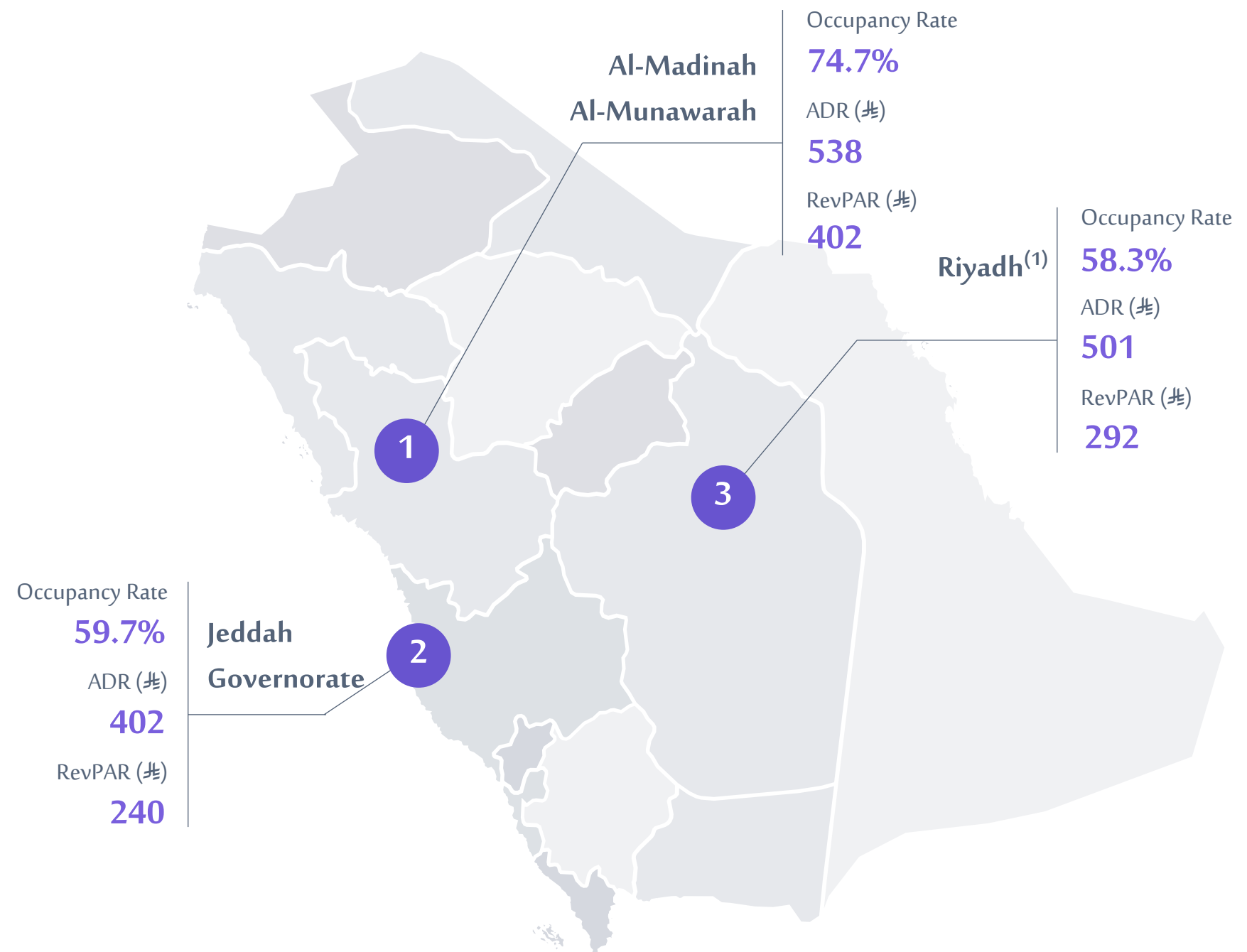


## First Half Performance – Overview

In H1 2025, the overall occupancy rate for tourism hospitality facilities in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, reached (56.6%) for hotels, apartments and others. Al-Madinah Al-Munawarah city led the way with the highest occupancy rate among the major cities and governorates at (74.7%), followed by Jeddah governorate at (59.7%). January 2025 emerged as the peak month for occupancy in H1 2025, reaching (63.4%).

Regarding revenue, the Average Daily Rate (ADR) for all tourism hospitality facilities in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia averaged (ﷲ 458). Hotels recorded a higher ADR of (ﷲ 546), while apartments & others averaged (ﷲ 205). Consequently, the Revenue Per Available Room (RevPAR) stood at (SAR 259) in H1 2025.

### Top Three Destinations by Performance

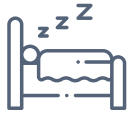

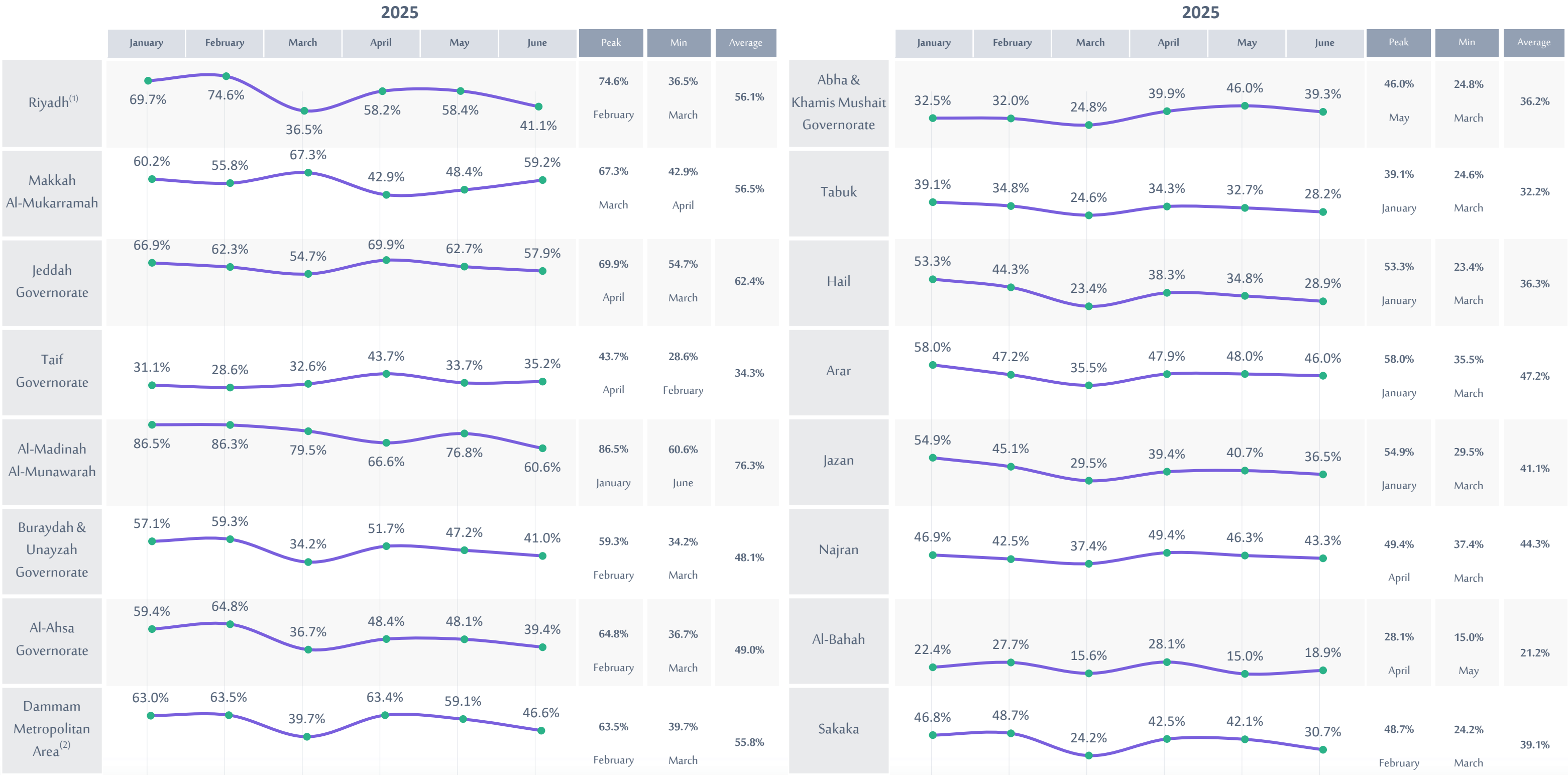

## Newly Licensed Facilities

In H1 2025, Makkah Al-Mukaramah city had the highest share of newly issued licenses for tourism hospitality facilities across major cities and governorates, accounting for (27%) of the total. Riyadh<sup>(1)</sup> city followed, with a share of (24%); this includes Hotels, Apartments & Others.

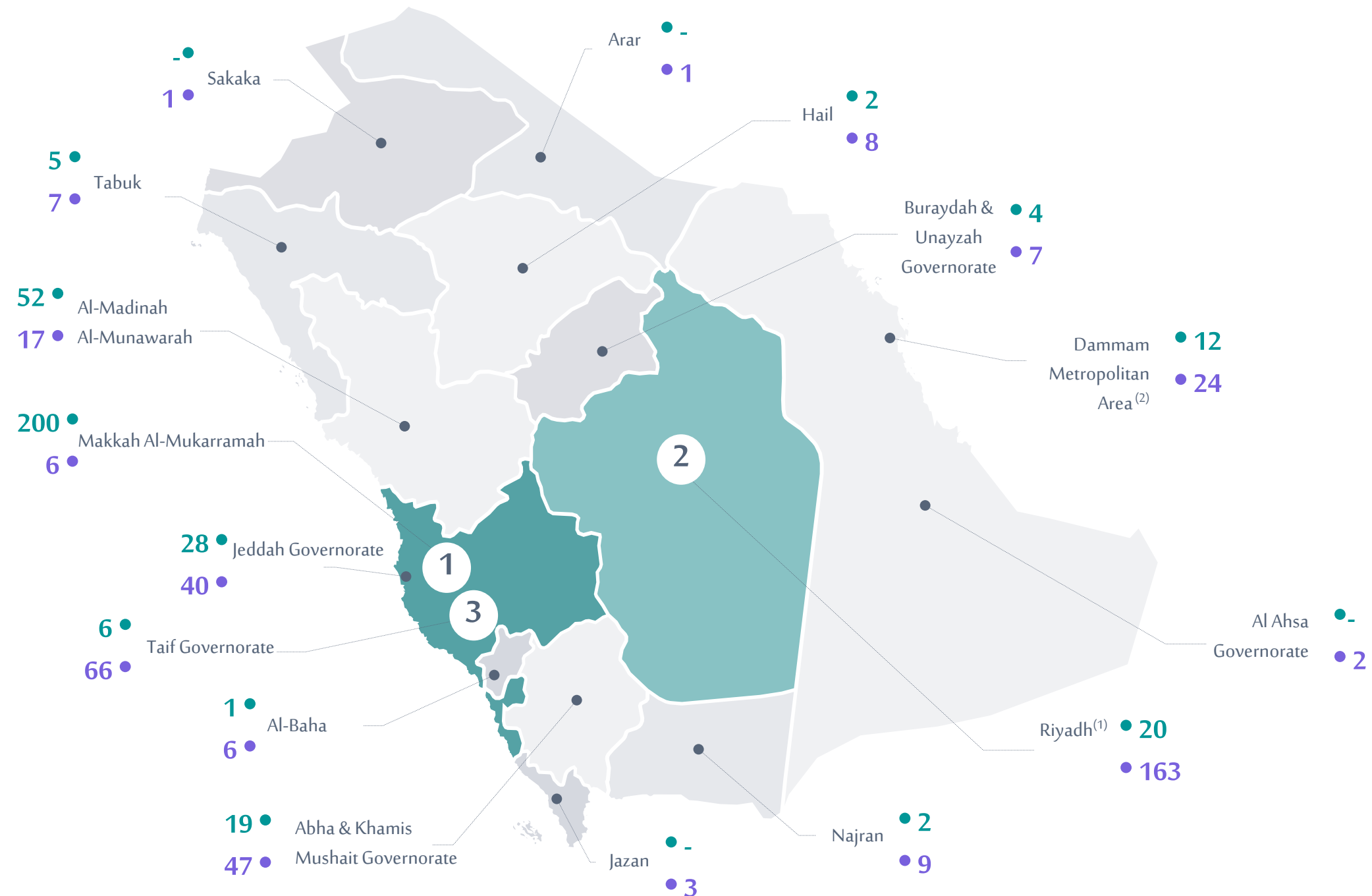

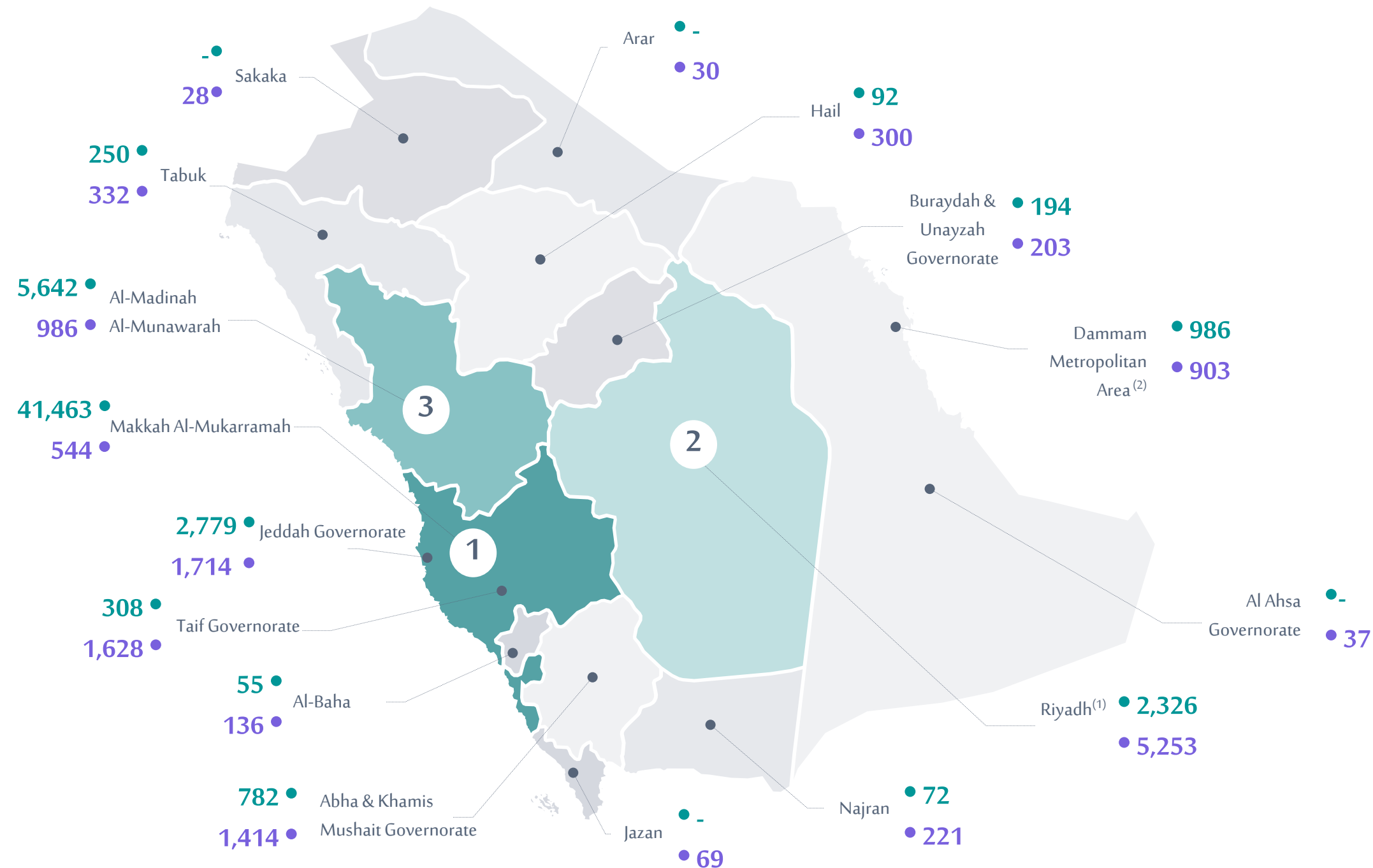

## Licensed Facilities

As of H1 2025, Saudi Arabia had licensed a total of (5,326) tourism hospitality facilities, with Hotels accounting for (47%) and Apartments & Others making up (53%).

Among the Kingdom's major cities and governorates, Makkah Al-Mukarramah city recorded the highest number of licensed facilities, totaling (1,203) Notably, (98%) of these were Hotels. Riyadh<sup>(1)</sup> city followed in second place with (943) licensed facilities, where (79%) were Apartments & Others

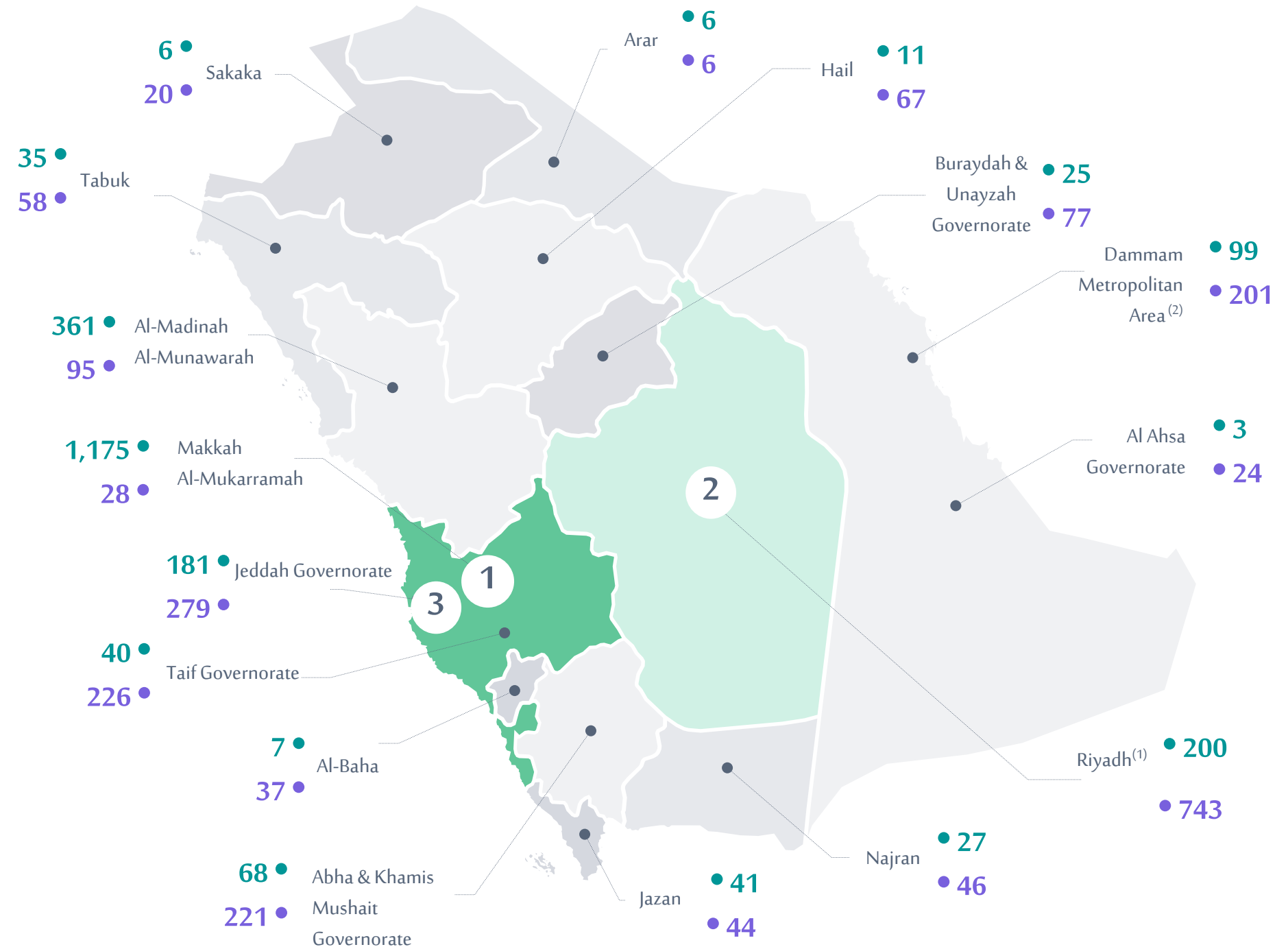

## Room Keys in Licensed Facilities

As of H1 2025, a total of (544,879) room keys were recorded in licensed tourism hospitality facilities across Saudi Arabia, with Hotels comprising (83%) and Apartments & Others (17%)

Makkah Al-Mukarramah city notably contributed the highest number of room keys at (305,764), with (99%) exclusively in Hotels. Al-Madinah Al-Munawarah city ranked second, recording (64,569) room keys, (94%) of which were also Hotel-based

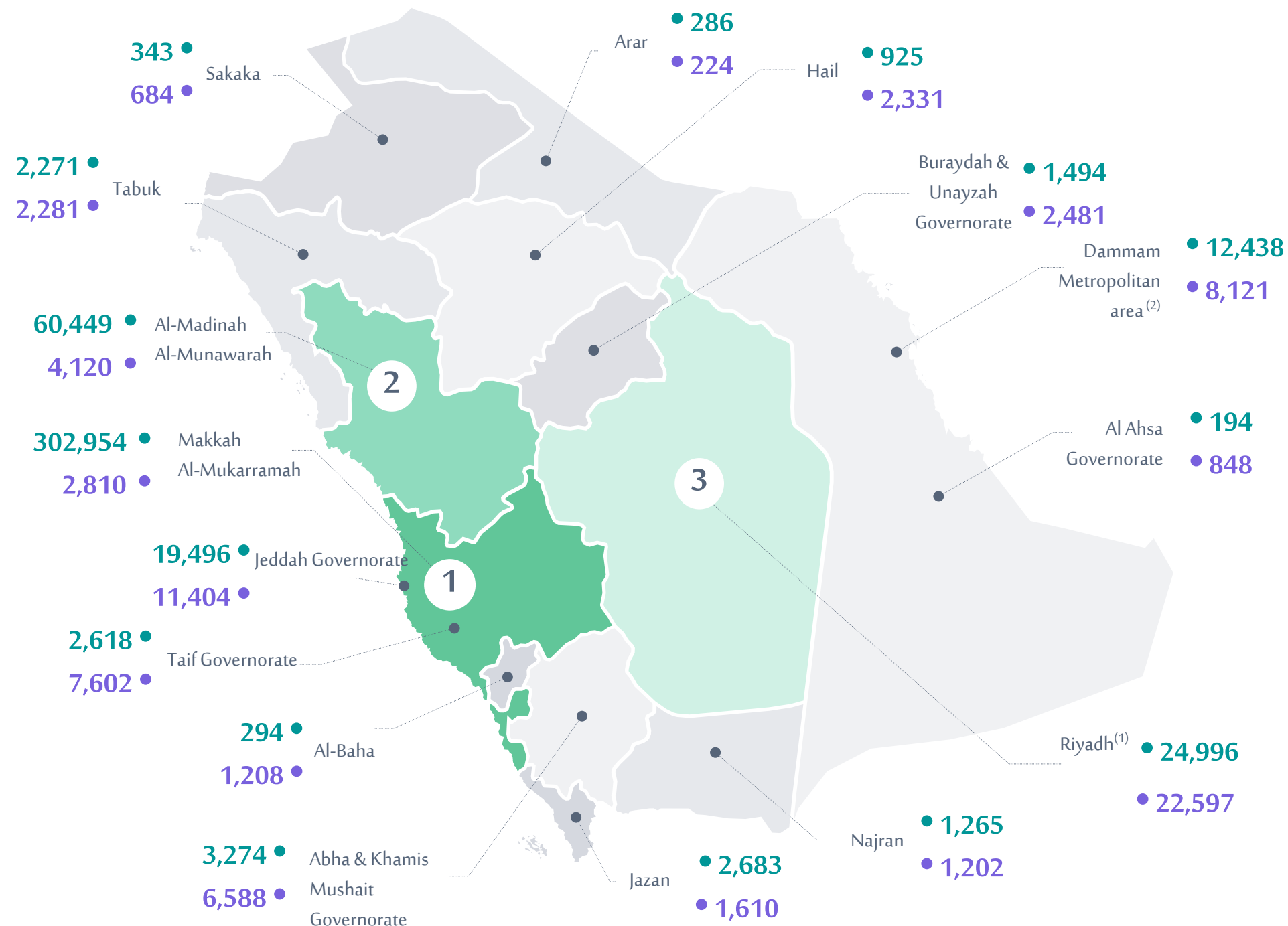

## Data Source

### National Tourism Monitoring Platform (NTMP)

NTMP is the main source of data for the sector's performance in terms of occupancy rates, Average Daily Rate (ADR), and Revenue Per Available Room (RevPAR). The content of this report is based on the data available at the time of its preparation and is subject to retroactive changes and updates. The sector's performance data is updated daily to ensure accuracy and timeliness. Licensed tourism hospitality facilities across Saudi Arabia are committed to providing real-time data updates through direct integration with the National Tourism Monitoring Platform.

### Tourism Activities Licensing Portal

The data presented in this report is sourced directly from official records maintained by the Ministry of Tourism through the Tourism Activities Licensing Portal. These records include licenses issued to tourism hospitality facilities in Saudi Arabia. The data is regularly updated to reflect changes in the licensing status of these facilities.

The Ministry of Tourism acknowledges its partners for their instrumental support for the sector's growth and development by sharing the required data, which has played a vital role in informing policy decisions and fostering sector innovation.
